

FAEA (Florida Art Education Association) Basics for New Art Teachers



Board of Directors

The Board of Directors is the official leadership team of FAEA. The Board is elected for a 2-year term and consists of a president, past-president, president-elect, secretary, division directors (elementary, middle school, high school, higher education, museum, and supervisor/administration), districts assembly representative, retired members' representative, members-at-large, and a CFAE board consultant.

CFAE

The Center for Fine Arts Education is an association management company that provides qualified professionals to manage the daily administration and planning for volunteer organizations like FAEA. Sharing these management services saves FAEA between 25-40% in overhead costs and ensures efficient operations. CFAE has a non-voting representative on the board of directors.

Divisions

FAEA is organized with representation for members sharing job duties that are alike. There are six divisions: elementary, middle school, high school, higher education, museum, and supervisor/administration. Each division has an elected director who is a voting member on the board of directors.

Appointed Positions and Members-at-Large

Several positions on the board of directors are appointed and non-voting. These individuals serve special constituencies (retired members and districts assembly—representatives of district organizations), have projects and duties important to the mission of the organization, or can be a part of the future leadership pool.

Conference Events

Awards Breakfast

FAEA honors individuals who have been recognized for outstanding service to the mission of the organization every year at the annual awards breakfast. All members are welcome to attend and demonstrate their appreciation for a job well done. Ticketed event.

General Assembly

All conference participants come together for two general sessions to hear keynote speakers, receive profession updates, and conduct association business.

Commercial Exhibitions

Corporations producing products and services related to art education support the annual conference by sharing and promoting in the exhibition hall and workshops.

Art Forum

An art forum is a non-hands-on information session included in the conference registration. An art forum can be presented in a number of formats.

Mini Studio Workshops and Half-Day Workshops

These sessions are ticketed, hands-on workshops that require sign-up and a fee in addition to the conference registration.

Member Virtual Exhibition

A juried exhibition produced by FAEA practicing artists. The exhibition is presented virtually at a reception in a museum/gallery setting.
